

2022 GRANTS ROUND APPLICATION GUIDELINES for the *RESEARCH AWARD*

AIM OF THE *RESEARCH AWARD*

In 2022, the Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund will make **one award** of \$85,000 to fund research to advance the *health, wellbeing and life experiences* of people with a disability, in particular people with an intellectual disability.

This award targets applicants with appropriate research qualifications, who are employed by an Australian host institution, at which they will conduct the proposed research project. The host institution can be a university, a university-affiliated research centre or institute, or an appropriate independent research centre or institute.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR THE *RESEARCH AWARD*?

Completed application forms along with any supporting documentation must be submitted using the **online submission form** (also located on the **Apply** webpage).

- The complete application (including any supporting documentation) must be uploaded as one file (preferably as a PDF file, however Word files are also acceptable). File size cannot exceed 5MB.

Applications **must** be uploaded via the online submission form by **5pm (AEST) on Thursday 14th April, 2022**. Applications submitted after this time will not be accepted.

KEY DATES FOR 2022 GRANTS ROUND:

- Round **opens** at 9:00am (AEST) on Monday 7th March, 2022
- Round **closes** at 5pm (AEST) on Thursday 14th April, 2022
- All applicants will be **notified** of the outcome of their application **via email** no later than Friday 20th May 2022
- Funding for approved grants will **commence** on Friday 17th June, 2022

WHAT CRITERIA ARE USED TO ASSESS APPLICATIONS?

The Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund will give preference to:

- Research projects that address issues where there is currently **little or no research** to inform service delivery.
- Research projects that address issues that have a **significant impact** on the health and wellbeing of people with a disability.
- Research projects that will **enhance the ability** of people with a disability to engage with the community and to lead a fulfilling life, with real possibilities.
- Applicants who engage with **priority issues** for the Australian disability sector.

The Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund is interested in the **successful translation** of research findings into practical resources that can support wider sector development and/or influence on-the-ground practice. These resources need to be in a form that is useful and accessible to people with a disability, practitioners, service providers and/or policy makers (depending on the target audience).

- Preference will be given to applicants who formulate a **dissemination strategy** in their grant application form that favours dissemination outputs beyond traditional academic outputs (e.g., journal articles, conference presentations).

Research projects will be assessed against the following **three criteria**:

- *Research impact* (impact of research question and potential outcomes for people with a disability).
- *Research quality* (excellence in project conception, methodology and leadership).
- *Productivity* (justification of resources, likelihood of successful delivery, and appropriate dissemination strategy).

WHAT EXPENSES CAN BE COVERED AND WHAT IS EXCLUDED?

Applicants may use *Research Award* funding to cover research expenses directly related to **data collection, transcription and analysis**. The following costs are not covered by the Research Award:

- The costs associated with conference attendance for dissemination purposes.
- University overheads or infrastructure costs.
- Applicants' salary costs, although it is acceptable to use funding to engage a research assistant or to buy out teaching time to conduct the research.
 - In cases where the applicant is a *Research Fellow* on a fixed-term contract, it may be legitimate for them to claim salary costs. In this case, please contact us to seek advice using the online enquiry form (www.endeavourresearchfund.com.au).

An example *Research Award* budget is attached to inform the level of detail required in your own budget description. The actual costs and items requested will vary according to your own project.

GOODS AND SERVICES (GST) TAX – INCLUDE OR EXCLUDE?

Including or excluding GST in your budget description will depend on whether your university, university affiliate or research institute is **registered** for GST. The following information is provided to guide your decision regarding whether to include or exclude GST from your budget description:

- **Registered for GST**
If your university, university affiliate or research institute is **registered** for GST, and can provide the Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund with a GST invoice for the grant amount plus 10% for GST, then the grant amount applied for in your budget description can **exclude GST**. In that, the applicant can apply for up to \$85,000 (excluding GST) for the *Research Award*.
- **Not Registered for GST**
If your university, university affiliate or research institute is **not registered** for GST, then your grant application budget **should be inclusive of any applicable GST on the budget cost item**. In that, the applicant can apply for up to \$85,000 (including GST) for the *Research Award*.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO IF I AM AWARDED THE *RESEARCH AWARD*?

Recipients of the Research Award will receive an **Acceptance Letter** containing a **Grant Agreement Form**, which will need to be signed and returned to the Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund.

You must nominate a **responsible research/grants office** at your university, university affiliate or research institute to administer the grant funding on your behalf. Your nominated office will receive a copy of the Acceptance Letter for their reference, and will be required to send an invoice to the Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund to request release of approved funds.

Part of your responsibility in accepting the *Research Award* includes **reporting** on your progress.

- You will be required to submit an annual **Progress Report every 6 months** during the course of the research project, outlining research activities, key achievements, and upcoming plans for the next 12 months (if the project is ongoing). You will also be asked to supply financial documentation tracking expenditure for the project.
- A **Final Report** will also be requested within six months of project conclusion. This final report will ask you to reflect on the overall achievements, outcomes and impact of the research, your completion of the funded deliverables and an acquittal of the Grant funds.

The Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund may ask for a **brief update** from time to time after your grant term has been completed. The purpose of this request will be to collect information about the long-term outcomes of your project.

WHAT CAN I DO IF MY APPLICATION IS NOT SUCCESSFUL?

All decisions of the Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund Board are considered **final**. The Endeavour Foundation Disability Research Fund receives many more requests than it is able to fund at any given time.
